## Which GCSE specification should I choose?

Please note that this guide should be read in conjunction with the DfE's subject content which sets out the material to be studied in relation to each topic of each religion and should not be taken as a substitute for the officially published content. All material is subject to Ofqual accreditation in the autumn term and could easily change between now and then.

## Full course - Option One
