

Which GCSE specification should I choose?

NATRE offers this guide to the draft specifications taken from material supplied by the awarding organisations. Please note that this guide should be read in conjunction with the **DfE's** subject content which sets out the material to be studied in relation to each topic of each religion and should not be taken as a substitute for the officially published content. All material is subject to **Ofqual** accreditation in the autumn term and could easily change between now and then.

Full course - Option One

Part One The study of **TWO religions** with a focus on TWO topics from each religion: Beliefs and Teachings and Practices (Worth 50% of the qualification)

Part Two The study of **FOUR themes** from texts and or philosophy and ethics in the modern world (Worth 50% of the qualification)

- 1(b) The study of a SECOND religion on TWO topics: Beliefs and Teachings, Practices, Sources of wisdom and authority (Worth 25% of the GCSE)
- 2 The study of TWO themes with a focus on texts and or philosophy and ethics in the modern world in one religion (Worth 25% of the GCSE)
