Data to support the writing of examination reports

How do the number of entries and results for each grade at your centre compare with those locally?

The source of this data is Ofqual. The full set can be found [here](#). Note that the results for each grade must be considered alongside the size of the entry for that county. It may be interesting however, to calculate what proportion of entries your school made in comparison to the entries for the whole county. This could be compared with the size of your year 13 cohort as a proportion of the county year 13 cohort.

The formatting indicates where the results for each grade are above or below the average for England. Again, the number of entries for a county would affect the statistical validity of this comparison.
