

<p>Name two other things that might happen as part of Shabbat on a Friday evening.</p> <p>Families will say prayers, eating a traditional roast meal, eating with family.</p>	<p>What is the name for the special bread eaten on Shabbat?</p> <p>Challah bread</p>	<p>How many candles are traditionally lit for Shabbat in a Jewish home?</p> <p>Two</p>	<p>When does Shabbat begin?</p> <p>Traditionally Shabbat begins at sunset (For Orthodox Jews this time will vary over the year, whilst many Reform Jews will observe Shabbat at a fixed time).</p>
<p>What do Jewish people say the kiddush blessing over?</p> <p>Cups of wine (or grape juice)</p>	<p>When does Shabbat end?</p> <p>At Havdalah: sunset on Saturday evening</p>	<p>Name three things that Jewish people might do differently for Shabbat.</p> <p>Some Jewish people will go to synagogue, many Orthodox families will not use electricity or their car, playing board games and spending time with families or friends.</p>
