

How evil? How do you judge?

Inequality: women get paid less than men for the same job	Laziness: someone knows what to do but thinks it is too much effort	Eating meat: being a carnivore leads to cruel treatment and early deaths of millions of animals each year	Hurricane: fierce storms can cause lots of damage to people and property
A virus causes a global pandemic that kills millions	A national government deliberately sets out to kill and eliminate an ethnic group (genocide)	Murder: <i>either</i> one person killed in a violent outburst; <i>or</i> several people murdered by a serial killer	Pain: <i>either</i> chest pain in a heart attack; <i>or</i> someone deliberately kicks your shins
Domestic violence: a person is regularly struck and hurt by their partner	Fraud: someone steals an item then returns it to claim a refund	Ghosting: someone breaks up with a partner without word or explanation	Prejudice: someone has a negative attitude to a person because of a group they belong to (e.g. gender, race, age, class)
Pollution: <i>either</i> you tip harmful white spirit down the sink; <i>or</i> oil companies create millions of tonnes of greenhouse gases	Disease: preventable diseases like malaria still claim millions of lives, particularly in Africa	A snakebite: painful but non-fatal bite from an adder while on a walk	Bad intentions: someone thinks about doing something hurtful or wrong, even if they don't carry it out
Avarice: someone seeks wealth and riches, without thought about how their goal might impact on others	Poverty: people do not have enough money to eat, or heat their homes, or support their families	Adultery: someone sleeps with someone else who is already married to/partner of someone else	Hatred: someone feels an emotion or attitude of hostility towards someone else
Arrogance: someone thinks they are better than other people, without good reason	Racism: a person dislikes a whole group of people e.g. because of the colour of their skin, and insults or mistreats them	Consumerism: someone just wants to <i>buy</i> stuff – possessions are most important to them; they are attached to material things	Sexism: someone treats another person unequally because of their gender
Patriarchy: the idea that social structures favour men, and millions of women struggle to get equal rights or opportunities	Apathy: someone just can't be bothered to take part in stuff, or to be active to change themselves or the world	Selfishness: a person, callously or unthinkingly, puts their own needs, feelings and desires before anyone else's	Floods: heavy rainfall, deforestation and removal of soil mean rivers flood houses built on the waterside – danger to life and property
Climate crisis: low-lying countries face devastating flooding as sea levels rise	War: an aggressive country invades its neighbour to claim the land, killing thousands of civilians indiscriminately	Animal testing: <i>either</i> beauty products <i>or</i> life-saving drugs are tested on animals for harmful effects before being used on humans	Trolling: a person posts false, insulting or hostile comments on social media, to provoke conflict and/or generate hurt
Coughing: someone with a cold, flu or other infectious illness coughs in public without covering their mouth	Lying: <i>either</i> an underage person lies to get into a nightclub <i>or</i> someone lies in court	Beauty norms: social ideas of what women should look like, so that women feel pressure to conform to these ideas	Thoughtlessness: someone doesn't pay any attention to the harm their actions may bring about
