## Jewish practice and identity

## Answers to Resource 1.7 matching exercise

<b>Parentage</b>	This refers to who your parents are. Jewish identity has traditionally been seen as passing through the mother's line.
<b>Heritage</b>	This is something that is handed down from the past, including history, traditions, practices, for example.
<b>Religion</b>	This is a complex term. It can be used to apply to systems of meaning, beliefs and practices (e.g. Judaism, Islam), as lived out in communities, often including ideas of the sacred and/or the divine.
<b>Culture</b>	This is a broad term that includes the way in which people live and express themselves, such as customs, beliefs, ideas, values, knowledge, habits, symbols, arts, institutions, etc.
<b>Upbringing</b>	This is how you are brought up, from childhood to adulthood.
<b>Ethnicity</b>	This term often refers to a social group with a shared culture and way of life, which might include common religion, language, nation, ancestry or traditions, for example.
